CLUB OFFICIAL CODE OF CONDUCT

In addition to Mundaring Netball Club's General Code of Conduct, you must meet the following requirements regarding your conduct during any activity held by or under the auspices of Mundaring Netball Club in your role as a Club Official. A Club Official includes any member of the Management Committee or appointed sub-committee, or Officers appointed by the Committee in accordance with Rule 41 of the Constitution.

1. Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others.
2. Be professional in, and accept responsibility for, your actions. Your language, presentation, manners and punctuality should reflect high standards.
3. Resolve club issues and conflicts fairly and promptly, and in an objective manner, through established procedures.
4. Maintain strict impartiality.
5. Be aware of and comply with your legal responsibilities, including anti-discrimination, child protection and occupational health and safety legislation.
6. Respect the regulations and authority of Netball WA and its member organisations, and not attempt to avoid or circumvent these regulations.
7. Be diligent in efforts to remain informed of Club activities and decisions, attend relevant meetings of Committee, sub-committee and EHNA as required and contribute to an informed and positive decision-making process.
8. Once a decision has been made by the Management Committee, support the decision and resolve all queries through the appropriate, established procedures.
9. Develop a positive netball environment by emphasising enjoyment and by providing appropriate development support.
10. Involve all relevant stakeholders (coaches, players, umpires and parents) in the planning, evaluation, leadership and decision-making related to Club programs and events.
11. In partnership with coaches and team officials ensure activities, equipment and facilities are safe and appropriate to the ability level of participating players. Activities, rules, equipment and training schedules should take into consideration the age, ability and maturity level of the participants.
12. Ensure that everyone (including club officials, coaches, players, parents, spectators, sponsors, umpires) emphasise fair play in netball activities and games.
13. Where appropriate, distribute the Mundaring Netball Club Codes of Conduct to coaches, players, umpires, parents and spectators.
